This is a 19th century brick-built cottage in Nealand Lane, which leads to the Altonham Farm. It is situated in a quiet and tranquil corner of Nealand. The cottage must have been built after 1820 as they do not appear on the Nealand Tithe Map of 1846. However there were several other old cottages in the lane at that time, some of which were destroyed according to a auction house of 1864.
